The American Heart Association (AHA) issued interim cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) guidelines that apply during the COVID-19 pandemic. The AHA recommended bystanders and lay rescuers administer "hands only" CPR without mouth-to-mouth ventilation to limit exposures to the SARS-CoV-2 virus that causes COVID-19.

The Revised AHA CPR Guidelines: C-A-B Pinch the victims nose. Give two one-second breaths. Repeat chest compressions and breathing steps, 30 compressions then two breaths, until emergency services arrive.

The Revised American Heart Association CPR Guidelines

The AHA guidelines "strongly recommend" that untrained / lay respondersperform "compression-only" CPR, sometimes known as CCR. However, medical professionals and trained lay peopleare still urged to give the victim two "rescue breaths"in between each series of 30 chest compressions.

The 2019 focused updates to the AHA Guidelines for CPR and ECC are based on ILCOR's international continuous evidence evaluation process, which involves hundreds of international resuscitation scientists and experts who evaluate, discuss, and debate thousands of peer-reviewed publications.

Highlights of the 2019 Guidelines Focused Updates

The 2015 AHA Guidelines Update for CPR and ECC is based on an international evidence evaluation process that involved 250 evidence reviewers from 39 countries. The process for the 2015 International Liaison Committee on Resuscitation (ILCOR) systematic review was quite different when compared with the process used in 2010.

HIGHLIGHTS - American Heart Association

The 2010 Guidelines put a strong emphasis on CPR quality. In 2013, the AHA published a Consensus Statement focused on strategies to improve CPR quality. 6 In 2015, the ILCOR ACLS Task Force evaluated the available clinical evidence to determine whether using physiologic feedback to guide CPR quality improved survival and neurologic outcome.

Part 7: Adult Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support ...

The American Heart Association announced its newest CPR recommendations on October 16 th, 2015. The new CPR guidelines are based on the latest scientific data from the previous 5 years. The new update has placed limits on how fast and deep chest compressions should be performed. The guidelines are updated every five years.

New American Heart Association CPR Guidelines

The ACLS recommendations in the 2010 guidelines 13 and the 2015 AHA guidelines update 12 state that it is reasonable to consider administering a 1-mg dose of intravenous/intraosseous epinephrine every 3 to 5 minutes during adult CPR.

2019 American Heart Association Focused Update on Advanced ...

The 2015 guidelines still recommend traditional CPR cycles of 30 chest compressions to two rescue breaths for one-rescuer CPR in all age groups and for two-rescuer CPR in adults. The 15:2 ratio of compressions to breaths remains in the 2015 guidelines for two-rescuer CPR for children and infants.
