The Arabian oryx, also called the white oryx, was extinct in the wild as of 1972, but was reintroduced to the wild starting in 1982. Initial reintroduction was primarily from two herds: the "World Herd" originally started at the Phoenix Zoo in 1963 from only nine oryx and the Saudi Arabian herd started in 1986 from private collections and some "World Herd" stock by the Saudi National Wildlife Research Center. As of 2009 there have been reintroductions in Oman, Saudi Arabia, Israel, the United Ar

Reproductive timing in *O. leucoryx* varies. However, in favorable conditions, a female can produce a calf once a year during any month. Most births among introduced herds in Oman and Jordan occur from October to May. Gestation period in this species is about 240 days.

Following the extinction of the Arabian oryx *Oryx leucoryx* in the wild in 1972 Jordan began a reintroduction programme in 1978 with 11 founding animals.

The Arabian oryx or white oryx is a medium-sized antelope with a distinct shoulder bump, long, straight horns, and a tufted tail. It is a bovid, and the smallest member of the genus *Oryx*, native to desert and steppe areas of the Arabian Peninsula. The Arabian oryx was extinct in the wild by the early 1970s, but was saved in zoos and private preserves, and was reintroduced into the wild starting in 1980. The last wild Ara bian oryx was probably killed in 1972, and its death became a symbol of human destruction of the natural world. The capture of a few of the last wild oryx in 1962 marked the creation of the ' world herd '. Through captive breeding, the return of descendants from the founder herd to Arabian lands was possible and oryx were first returned to the wild in Oman in 1982.

Reintroduction

The return of the Arabian oryx *Oryx leucoryx* to Oman symbolized the success of a new approach to species conservation and established reintroduction as a conservation tool. Ten years after the species had been exterminated in the wild by poaching, the first 10 founder oryx, descendants of the 'World Herd', were reintroduced to the desert in central Oman in January 1982.
