A Department of Transportation (DOT) physical examination must be conducted by a licensed "medical examiner" listed on the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) National Registry. The term includes, but is not limited to, doctors of medicine (MD), doctors of osteopathy (DO), physician assistants (PA), advanced practice nurses (APN), and doctors of chiropractic (DC).

The CDL physical test must be conducted by a qualified medical examiner listed on the FMCSA National Registry. DOT physical exams are generally administered by approved doctors of medicine, physician assistants, doctors of chiropractic, advanced practice nurses and doctors of osteopathy.

DOT CDL Physical Exam Physicians Instructions 391.43 (a) (FMVSR) Except as provided by paragraph (b) of this section, the medical examination shall be performed by a licensed medical examiner as defined in §390.5 of this subchapter. A Department of Transportation (DOT) physical examination is conducted by a licensed "medical examiner."

DOT medical guidelines outline the health criteria that commercial vehicle drivers must meet to qualify for certification. One health condition that is closely reviewed by the DOT is diabetes. Individuals with known or suspected diabetes are required to provide specific medical information to the DOT-certifying physician regarding diabetic control.

Drivers will be required to certify that the information they give is accurate and true, and that false or missing information may, and probably will, invalidate their Medical Certificate. Drivers can look over the Official Medical Examination Report 649-F (6045) that your Medical Examiner will fill out and transmit to the DOT after your physical.

Your blood pressure needs to be under 140/90. Stage 1 hypertension , blood pressure between 140/90 - 159/99: 1-year medical certificate, must be renewed every 12 months.; Stage 2 hypertension , blood pressure between 160/100 - 179/109: 3 month medical certification.Full disqualification if not under control after 3 months, until controlled. Will be required to renew every 12 months.

Hearing. General physical exam. A DOT physical can cover up to twelve different categories of wellness, ranging from neurological to vascular. The driver may be asked to bring past medical records, and even correctional devices such as eye glasses, contacts or hearing aids to their DOT physical.

DOT Physical Requirements: Blood Pressure & Drug Tests ...

Acute Myocardial Infarction (Heart Attack) At the onset of an acute myocardial infarction, the individual should immediately be placed on temporary suspension from DOT certification. To regain certification, the individual must be at least two months past the time of their infarction and must be cleared by a cardiologist to return to work.

DOT CDL Physical Exam Drivers Minimum Requirements and Qualifications including Vision Acuity, Field of Vision (Peripheral Vision) and Color perception requirements, Number of Limbs, Blood Pressure Limits, Hearing Test, Diabetes, Mental Disorders, Respiratory System, Prescription Drug Use and Controlled Substances, Medical History, Drivers Responsibilities and Duties.

The physician's report should have full details of the driver's current level of diabetic control. Without a primary physician's waiver, diabetic drivers will not be approved for DOT certification. FMCSA is beginning a National Registry of Certified Medical Examiners (NRCME).
