Early Christianity (EC) 1868-7032 (1868-8020) - Mohr Siebeck

This became known as the "Apostolic Decree" and may be one of the first acts differentiating early Christianity from Judaism. Circumcision was enjoined upon the biblical patriarch Abraham, his descendants and their slaves as "a token of the covenant " concluded with him by God for all generations, as an "everlasting covenant".
