The medical history, case history, or anamnesis (from Greek: ἀνά, aná, "open", and μνήσις, mnēsis, "memory") of a patient is information gained by a physician by asking specific questions, either of the patient or of other people who know the person and can give suitable information, with the aim of obtaining information useful in formulating a diagnosis and providing medical care to the patient.
