He disagreed with the idea that intelligence was a fixed trait, and regarded cognitive development as a process which occurs due to biological maturation and interaction with the environment.

Jean Piaget's theory of cognitive development suggests that children move through four different stages of mental development. His theory focuses not only on understanding how children acquire knowledge, but also on understanding the nature of intelligence. 1 Piaget's stages are: Sensorimotor stage: birth to 2 years.

Between ages 2 and 7, children are egocentric and have trouble understanding different viewpoints or empathizing with others. They classify objects by a single characteristic, such as color or shape, without acknowledging other qualities.
