Tips for Creating and Scoring Essay Tests

A rubric is a scoring guide used to assess performance against a

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set of criteria. At a minimum, it is a list of the components you are looking for when you evaluate an assignment. At its most advanced, it is a tool that divides an assignment into its component parts, and provides explicit expectations of acceptable and unacceptable levels of performance for each component.
